- In-classroom mentors/coaches to confer and problem-solve with on a daily basis
- Limited opportunities for staff children to participate in camp

Philosophy of Kids for Camp – Autism Pensacola's Kids for Camp program is dedicated to the use of best-practice techniques, specifically Applied Behavior Analysis, to contribute to both the skill acquisition of the individuals with autism and the continuing education of the teachers, support staff, and college students who work with those with autism. It is API's intention to continuously improve the camp experience, thus remaining a model of quality and integrity to the community.

Position: Instructor

Goal: Using techniques learned in training, implement teaching strategies to achieve targeted objectives for your assigned students, as well as keeping accurate data on progress.

Job Responsibilities:

- Support lead teacher in the designing of classroom activities
- Model open communication across the entire team staff, parents, and volunteers
- Obtain accurate data on targets for each camper under your supervision
- Participate fully in all classroom activities and field trips
- Communicate with lead teacher about camper progress
- Perform other jobs and duties on request as needed


Job Requirements:

- Team player
- Ability to support teacher in creating instructional materials
- Ability to accept constructive, objective feedback
- Ability to interact in a classroom with highly-active children, teens, and young adults
- The job requires 50% standing, 40% walking, 10% sitting
- Be able to actively participate in strenuous outdoor activities
- Other physical demands Be able to lift 25 pounds; some carrying, pushing, and/or pulling.


